

## JUBILATION AS COURT RULES THAT THE EVICTION OF THE KIBOS COMMUNITY BY KENYA RAILWAYS WAS ILLEGAL



**JUSTICE HAS FINALLY BEEN SERVED FOR KIBOS COMMUNITY**

The Environmental and Land Court of Kisumu gave their judgement on Friday, 27 August 2021, where they found the Kenya Railways Corporation and the Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government guilty of gross human rights violations in the forced evictions of 3,000 Kibos residents on 5 February 2021.

In the ruling, Justice Antony Ombayo highlighted that 'the court has a duty to protect every individual against the state from the violation of their fundamental rights and guard against state brutality on its citizens and to ensure that each state organ and its officers practice the national values as enshrined in chapter 10 of the constitution of Kenya.'

The ruling agrees with the prayers for the petitioners representing over 3,000 residents who have been homeless for the last six months. One of the strongest rulings yet on forced eviction, the Court found that forcible and brutal evictions of the Kibos residents without alternative shelter and compensation was aagrant violation of the right to life, security of the person and the right to human dignity, national values and principles of the constitution.

Kituo Cha Sheria and seven other human rights organizations had filed a claim for compensation on behalf of the 3000 Kibos residents who had been forcefully evicted by the Kenya Railways Corporation in early February this year.

Kituo Cha Sheria Advocate, Tracy Wachira, helped the Kibos community in the petition where Kituo wa enjoined as an interested party in the case where the community has been living

as squatters in IDP Camps in Kibos Village in Kisumu County after being illegally evicted to pave way for the rehabilitation of the old railway line from Nakuru to Kisumu. They were forcefully evicted by Kenya Railways despite the conservatory order that was issued by the court.

On 21st July 2021 Justice Anthony Ombwayo of Kisumu Environment & Land Court visited Kibos Nubian community to inspect the demolition site. Kituo's Legal Aid Programme Coordinator, Advocate John Mwariri was also part of the team that visited the site. The judge also presided over an event where surveyors submitted 100 acres of ownership documents for the over 3,000 evicted Kibos residents during the visit.

Together with partners: Haki Yetu, Transparency International and Jack Maina, they filed Petition 39 of 2016 which echoed the residents' sentiments calling for quality public participation.

## Kituo Officer wins the Pro-bono Advocate of the year - Coast Region



## 22 years and counting for victims of US Embassy bombing in Nairobi



Twenty-two years after bombing of the US Embassy in Nairobi, thousands of Kenyans victims and families of the dead and wounded are still crying for justice. The victims of the 1998 bomb blast have been abandoned and shunned by our government. This is considering the US has ensured that their citizens who got injured or who died obtained reparations/ compensation.

In these cases the victims were awarded a total of \$4.3 billion. However, most Kenyan victims were not awarded compensation on the basis that they are not American citizens or were not employees of the US embassy. Only a handful of Kenyan employees working for

the embassy were awarded compensation which surprisingly was also less than that awarded to their American counterparts. This matter was also tabled before parliament and was referred to the legal committee of parliament and to date there has been no outcome.

Kituo Cha Sheria together with the victims are in the process of filing a case in which they seek among others a declaration that the government compromised or violated the rights to life, security of Person and the legitimate expectation of the of the Petitioners and the estates in whose behalf they bring this suit under Sections 26 and 29 of the Constitution of Kenya.

The EU Delegation led by H.E. Amb. Kituo team and the EU delegation held separate meetings with Prison Officers and prison paralegals to highlight the critical role the EU support has played in enhancement of access to justice to prisoners through the PLEAD project and to Monitor and track the efficiency of Prison Justice Centers.

Kituo has been providing access

to justice for the poor and marginalized in Prison facilities where Shimo La Tewa is one such institution benefiting from this support. The focus is to enhance access to justice for the poor and marginalized in the facility.

Under PLEAD project that commenced in 2019, Kituo has trained 60 paralegals, held meetings intended to strengthen justice centre, conducted legal aid exercises within the prison, celebrated international days and provided stationery to the facility. The paralegals have continued to draft appeals, guide on plea bargaining, petitions, providing legal guidance for fellow inmates and those within the justice centres.

The Forced Migration Program's Mental Health and Psychosocial Support team on 12th and 13 August 2019 conducted trainings on self-care, self-awareness and personality types for the staff at Mombasa regional office.

attending to the trainings and discussing work life challenges that they face and how they can mitigate. On the second day, the team had fun and bonding games to re-energize and rejuvenate

Are you new to the system?

If yes, click on the sign-up button and choose an account you want to register (Law firm, Organization, individual)

- Step 1** - Enter your valid details
- Step 2** - Enter your contact details
- Step 3** - Enter log in Details (the desired password)
- Step 4** - Confirm your account details and submit (Ensure you enter the correct contact details; E-mail & Telephone

- Step 5** - Activate your account (An email notification will be sent directly to your email address for account activation. Valid for 24 hours)
- Step 6** - After successful activation, login and proceed with the filing.

On 14th July 2021, the Attorney General was given 21 days to get Health CS Mutahi Kagwe to file an affidavit in a case seeking to compel the Judiciary to resume physical court hearings. The affidavit by the CS is meant to confirm whether courts should be opened for public hearings. Judge James Makau told the parties in the matter that he will give his judgment on October 14.

In the case filed by Kituo cha Sheria, the court heard that many Kenyans are suffering from lack of access to justice as they cannot access the virtual court hearing and the e-filing system. This is because most Kenyans cannot afford mobile phones, computers and they lack technological skills to access the virtual court system.

Through lawyers John Khaminwa and John Mwariri, the lobby group stressed that the court needs to rule on the matter as the Chief Justice and the state had failed to show the initiatives and the programmes they had put in place to ensure poor Kenyans access justice. "In this regard justice was only being served by the court to a few rich Kenyans and advocates. Justice therefore is perceived as

elitist," the lobby group said. The Law Society of Kenya which is also a party to the matter, told the court that its members have complained that the e-filing portal is at times unresponsive and takes a lot of time, sometimes even a fortnight to get help from the court assistants or officials at the registry.

The society also says advocates have faced challenges when paying filing fees auto generated by the e-filing system as at times the payment do not reflect and or the monies sent bounce back and receive an error message that Judiciary account is not capable of receiving funds. "These results in late filing and service of the documents, hence occasioning an unnecessary hardship to the advocates," an affidavit sworn by Mercy Wambua reads in part.

Also raised by LSK is the fact that sometimes the links provided by the courts get changed without members being notified in good time. "... It takes time for members to be allowed in the virtual session, sometimes even getting their matters have already been called and adverse orders made against them despite the court having notice of the challenges."

## Refugee Community Training on Psychological First-Aid and Basic Counseling

Kituo Cha Sheria on 9-11 August 2021 conducted a training on psychological first aid for the urban refugees residing in Mombasa. The three-day activity that took place at Pride Inn Azure Mombasa County aimed to build reliable community structures for easier reach to the poor marginalized and mentally ill refugees in Mombasa.

The learning that was spearheaded by the MHPSS team had a simulated exercise to enact real life scenarios and how to deal with them. During the first day, the team spent time understanding PFA concepts and application. On the second

and third day, the team conducted simulation exercises, learn about basic counselling skills and had a closing ceremony.

Kituo conducts such trainings to refugees to enable them to understand the basic counselling techniques and skills therefore enabling them to offer basic support before escalating and referring for professional assistance.

Kituo Cha Sheria's Forced Migration Programme on 2nd August, 2021 held a dialogue on the effects of the Covid-19 Pandemic on Refugees at Leven House, Mombasa. The meeting that constituted of 45 people including representatives from different nationalities; Congolese, Somali, Rwandese and Burundi was facilitated by Ms. Alice, Mr. Shem, Mr. Allan, Mr. Mohamed and Ms. Kerry.

The person's present were divided into 3 cell groups where they were instructed to discuss within themselves the problems they face and the effects Covid-19 has had on their lives. Among the key issues raised by the refugees are; Loss and lack of jobs, Lack of

adequate finances due to no jobs, Hardships getting documentation and ID cards as a refugee or asylum seeker, Service provides refusing to recognize refugee ID's thereby excluding them from services such as M-PESA, NTSA etc, they face a lot of discrimination and stigmatization in the society, Covid-19 has claimed the lives of many refugees because they are unable to access medical attention among others.

Kituo noted the concerns for further inquiries into the matters raised. The activity was conducted by Kituo officers Elsie Alice and Shem Alubala with support from the Civil Peace Service Programme (CPS) of GIZ
